Speaker

MRS. LISA JOHNSON-BILLY

Lisa Johnson Billy is serving her 14th year in the Chickasaw Nation tribal legislature. She holds a bachelor's degree in business merchandising from Northeastern State University and a master's degree in education from the University of Oklahoma. She is currently pursuing her doctoral degree at Oral Roberts University.

Lisa was elected to the Oklahoma House of Representatives (HD-42) in 2004, becoming the first woman and Native American to hold the position. She was termed out after serving 12 years. While in office, she created the Oklahoma Native American Caucus and served as the floor leader. She also held the position of Chair of the Public Safety Appropriations Committee. Lisa received numerous awards, including Legislator of the Year by the Oklahoma State Troopers Association, the Oklahoma Public Employees Association, and the Kate Barnard Award for her work on prison reform.

In 2017, Lisa was appointed by President Trump and confirmed by the Senate to the Udall Foundation, where she is the first Native person to be elected as Chair of the trustees. In 2019, the Oklahoma Senate unanimously voted for Lisa as the first Secretary of Native American affairs to the Oklahoma state governor's cabinet.

The Oklahoma Speaker of the House recently appointed Lisa as a commissioner to the Oklahoma Department of Transportation. She is only the second woman in Oklahoma's history to serve in this role. As a Chickasaw legislator, Lisa continues to champion initiatives that honor and uplift Chickasaw identity, faith, and culture. She reintroduced the Chickasaw language as part of the official legislative process. The Journal Record recently recognized her as one of 50 women of influence.

Lisa and her husband recently celebrated their 34th anniversary. They have three children who each serve in the military, one grandson, and one granddaughter on the way.

Honorary Doctor of Divinity

REV. BRIAN WIESINGER

Rev. Brian Wiesinger was appointed in January 2024 as the 7th District Superintendent of the Southwest Oklahoma District Church of the Nazarene. Brian has served 40 years in full-time pastoral ministry—12 years as a youth pastor in Oklahoma and Arizona, and 28 years as a lead pastor. His ministry leadership included Lake Overholser Church of the Nazarene (Bethany, OK), Columbia Grace Church of the Nazarene (Columbia, TN), and Crossing Church of the Nazarene (Westminster, CO).

A two-time graduate of Southern Nazarene University, Brian earned a bachelor's degree in Christian Education (1986) and a master's degree in Ministry (1993). He also served as an adjunct professor for Trevecca Nazarene University and was ordained as an elder on the Northwest Oklahoma District in 1995.

Brian met his wife, Kimberly while they were both in high school in Phoenix, Arizona and followed one another to SNU. Brian and Kim have been married 40 years and are blessed with three daughters; Madison, Mylee, and Maci, and one son, Brady; two sons-in-law, Blaine and Braden; and a granddaughter, Beckett Mae. They are expecting another granddaughter in May 2026. Rev. Wiesinger has faithfully served the Church of the Nazarene with a deep passion for helping others experience a transforming relationship with Jesus Christ. He is devoted to investing in and empowering church leaders to fulfill God's purpose for their lives and ministries. Brian and Kim have exemplified a lifetime of faithful service to the church and the Kingdom of God.

Commencement Information

ACADEMIC MACE

The honor of Academic Mace Bearer is awarded by a faculty vote to a senior member of the SNU faculty in recognition of dedicated service and outstanding qualities that exemplify the SNU motto "Character / Culture / Christ." Today the mace is carried by Dr. Nicholas Zoller, Professor and Chair, Computing, Mathematics, and Physics, School of Undergraduate Studies. Dr. Zoller has served full-time as an SNU faculty member since 2009.

The academic mace traces its origins to the medieval battle mace and royal scepter and was adopted in the 14th century as a symbol of the university's ideals and commitment to learning. On ceremonial occasions at SNU, the mace is carried by a senior faculty member at the head of the procession. For commencement exercises, the mace is placed in its stand to signal the beginning of the ceremony and removed to mark the ceremony's end.

The SNU academic mace made its inaugural journey in the May 2008 Commencement. It is crafted in walnut from a tree that once grew on SNU's campus, and the stand is made from wood salvaged from another historic SNU building called The Tabernacle where early Nazarenes once worshiped. Both of these pieces of wood, though cracked and flawed, were saved by the late Dr. Lyle Tullis, SNU Professor Emeritus of Sociology, whose life and service impacted countless SNU colleagues and students. His son, Dr. K. J. Tullis used this wood to craft the mace.

Hoods are unique to educational institutions and are vestments that identify the degree conferred and the granting institution. Students receiving master's degrees today are vested with a hood with the SNU colors identified in the silk lining. The edging of the hoods shows the colors of degrees conferred today: drab for Master of Business Administration and Master of Leadership, white for Master of Arts, golden-yellow for Master of Science, and light blue for Doctor of Education.

Cords and medallions worn by degree candidates signify membership in honor societies, participation in the Ronald E. McNair Postbaccalaureate Achievement program, participation in Student Support Services, participation in the Presidential Leadership Scholar program, participation in the LiveLast service program or completion of the SNU Honors Program. Military students and faculty are wearing red, white, and blue cords signifying their service.

DISTINGUISHED ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS

The Distinguished Achievement Award is an honor granted to students from each cohort in the School of Professional Studies. Selection is based on outstanding scholarship and exceptional leadership within the program and on recommendations by program directors, faculty and classmates. Recipients are identified with the ^ symbol in the degree candidates list. This marks the 40th year for the presentation of these awards.
