The Master of Science in Counseling Psychology (MSCP) degree is a 60-hour program designed to meet the state of Oklahoma's academic licensure requirements for the Licensed Professional Counselor (LPC). The MSCP degree, in addition to the 30 hours of core psychology coursework, consists of a minimum of 21 additional hours in counseling-specific coursework, including counseling methods, theoretical foundations and applications, and treatment. In addition to the courses, MSCP students complete 150 hours of practicum and 450 hours of internship, with 250 of those hours being direct client contact. Practicum and internship will occur concurrently with coursework.

STEP 2

If you meet the application requirements, you can complete the rest of the application process online. You will need **three recommendations; curriculum vitae/resume; personal statement essay; background check release.**
