ABOUT

The SNU departments of Biology and Chemistry offer a broad introduction to modern science as preparation for entering veterinary medical schools. Our courses range from microbiology to cadaver dissection and from biochemistry to analytical chemistry. The biology-chemistry curriculum includes a supporting background in mathematics, physics, and behavioral science. At SNU, the student will personally use instruments for lab experiments and research such as UV-Vis, FTIR, multinuclear FT-NMR, and HPLC-ESI-Mass spectrometers, as well as PCR, RT-qPCR, and various microscopes.

Students are encouraged to get involved in research and practical experiences either on the SNU campus or at our world-class biological field station in Costa Rica, the Quetzal Education Research Center (QERC), at which students can spend a semester studying abroad. Through our uniquely designed environment of reading research literature together, connecting lab experiments to biomedical applications, and solving problems individually and in collaborative teams, students are exceptionally prepared to pursue a Doctor of Veterinary Medicine (DVM) degree.

GENERAL EDUCATION

General Education forms the foundation of every student's academic journey at SNU. As a Christian liberal arts university, we are committed to equipping students with the knowledge, values, and skills essential for their development as both thoughtful Christians and engaged community leaders. Our General Education curriculum is intentionally designed to be both comprehensive and flexible—allowing students to pursue their individual interests while ensuring they graduate prepared for lifelong learning, service, and growth.

The General Education program consists of approximately 51 credit hours that introduce and develop important skills such as the:
