# 01 MOVE IN PROCESS

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## GETTING HERE

- 01** Arrive on your move-in day.
- 02** Check into New Student Institute outside of the Commons Building.
- 03** After checking in, drive directly to your residence hall where you have been assigned.

- 04** Park your vehicle and check in at your building's front desk to receive your room key and start moving in!

# FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

## MOVE IN & RESIDENCE LIFE

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### WHEN CAN I MOVE IN?

Residence Halls will open at 8am on the Friday of New Student Institute (NSI). Click below to see move-in dates and times in the Move-In tab for the most updated information.

Those involved in fall sports that begin practice early will receive move-in information from their coach.

### CAN I CHANGE MY ROOM ASSIGNMENT OR ROOMMATE?

We are unable to accommodate roommate changes after rooms are assigned and communicated. Within the first 2 weeks of school, each suite or roommate pair will complete a covenant to be proactive about any potential concerns. Residence Life Staff will also be available in that time and throughout the year to help set each roommate pair up for success.

### HOW DO I SELECT A MEAL PLAN?

You don't have to! All students living in our Traditional Residence halls (Hills, Bracken, and Snowbarger) are placed on the unlimited meal plan.

### WHERE CAN I DO MY LAUNDRY?

Laundry facilities are located in your residence hall.

### IS THERE HOUSEKEEPING AVAILABLE TO CLEAN MY ROOM?

You will be responsible for the cleanliness of your own room, disposing of trash properly, and leaving all public spaces in clean condition. The Maintenance staff will clean the public spaces, such as lobbies and community bathrooms.

*\*\*Cleaning Kits are available upon request to your Resident Director.*

### IS THERE KITCHEN ACCESS?

Yes! There are kitchens available for resident use upon request in Hills and Bracken.

Students are responsible for bringing their own supplies if desiring to use the kitchen.

## SHOULD I GET INSURANCE FOR MY BELONGINGS?

SNU is not responsible for lost or stolen items. We strongly encourage you to invest in additional property insurance for your student's belongings. We encourage parents and students to make sure they have the protection they desire for student property.

## WHERE DO I GET MY ROOM KEY?

Keys can be picked up in the lobby of your building on move in day. If you are moving in early for a fall sport, your coach will communicate key pick up details.

## **STORM THE CAMPUS**



In order for a student to be an active, current student for any given semester, Storm the Campus (SNU's verification event) is required. Students must be verified at the beginning of each semester. Storm the campus is a two day event giving students the opportunity to complete verification on the day before and the first day of classes. This process normally takes under an hour for each student.

## **ALL HALL MEETINGS**



This meeting will inform students on what to expect for the year in their living space and important details for each building. They will be introduced to their RA, sign the lifestyle covenant and sign up for roommate covenant meetings. They will also hear from and speak to the Resident Director to review all expectations in the Residence hall and on campus.



# 07 YOUR FIRST SIX WEEKS

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Getting involved and connected at SNU is a valuable step in helping students transition to SNU. Look out for weekly programs happening both in your Residence Halls and in the SNU community the first weeks of the semester!

## YOUR RESIDENT ADVISOR

We hire student leaders to create community and walk along side you during your time at SNU. They will be reaching out and checking in to offer support that is specific to you.

## ROOMMATE COVENANT

Your RA will help you and your roommate(s) in facilitating a roommate agreement. This conversation helps in creating a successful living situation between you and your roommate.
