Speaker **DR. DAVID GRAVES**

Dr. David W. Graves is a general superintendent in the Church of the Nazarene. Dr. Graves was chosen for the highest elected office in the denomination at the 27th General Assembly held in Orlando, Florida, USA, in 2009. At the time of his election, Dr. Graves was the senior pastor of College Church of the Nazarene in Olathe, Kansas, where he had served since 2006.

Prior to College Church, he served as director of Sunday School Ministries for the Church of the Nazarene International Headquarters from 2001 to 2006. He has had pastoral assignments in Kansas, Ohio, Tennessee, Oklahoma, and North Carolina. Graves is a graduate of Olivet Nazarene University and received his Master of Divinity degree from Nazarene Theological Seminary. He received an honorary Doctor of Divinity from Olivet. The author of three books, he has also written for numerous publications.

Dr. Graves and his wife, Sharon, have four married children, Michael, John, Stephen, and Rachel, and 12 beautiful grandchildren.

BETTY LOU THOMPSON

Betty Lou Bingaman Thompson was raised on a family ranch on the plains of South Dakota. She came to Bethany Nazarene College in 1971 as an elementary education major. Her teaching career took her to Pennsylvania and South Dakota. After serving as a children's pastor in Kansas, she returned to Oklahoma to teach in the Oklahoma Public School system for 5 years.

In 1986, she joined the School of Education faculty of Southern Nazarene University, and has served for 37 years in that capacity. While at Southern Nazarene University, Betty Lou has been recognized with the Excellence in Faculty Performance award. Her greatest joys in teaching have come from personal relationships with students, while advising as many as 70 students per semester. Many of Betty Lou's students have gone on to receive recognition as "Teachers of the Year" in school districts across the country.

Children's Literature is her passion and while attempting to keep up with current authors, her reading lists are long and varied. Betty Lou was also the initiator and founder of the SNU School of Education Reading Clinic, where Early Childhood, Elementary and Middle School future educators have access to teaching/tutoring materials and resources. No other private institution Teacher Education program in Oklahoma has this type of facility that helps equip future teachers with diagnostic and remedial reading tools and resources. Multiple student teaching observations took up a large portion of her teaching load each semester. During the course of her service at SNU, Betty Lou has supervised and advised over 400 education majors. Watching her students mature into exceptional instructors brought great satisfaction and fulfillment to her career at SNU.

Her greatest commitment is to God and family. Her five children and six grandchildren will continue to make her life meaningful. Betty Lou's life verse is: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, mind, and soul....and your neighbor as yourself." Matthew 22:37. This verse has helped her to maintain the focus that represents the life she has lived at Southern Nazarene University

Honorary Doctorate

ELEANOR WHITSETT

Eleanor Beck Watkins Whitsett was born in Kansas City, Missouri. At age four, Eleanor demonstrated a God-given gift for music and began playing piano for her church at age twelve. Upon graduation from Asbury University with a degree in piano performance, Eleanor and Lowell Don Whitsett were married on March 3, 1956. Eleanor used her gifts for the worldwide radio ministry of the Church of the Nazarene and served as organist for eight Church of the Nazarene General Assemblies and Conventions. She has also completed a variety of arranging and publishing projects for vocal, choral and keyboard for the Lillenas Publishing Company and served on the Advisory Committee for the Nazarene hymnal, "Sing to the Lord."

In 1972, Eleanor earned a Master of Music degree in Organ Performance from the University of Missouri-Kansas City. Eleanor, Don and their two boys, John and Jeffrey, moved to Oklahoma City where she played organ at her local church and served as Adjunct Professor of Organ and Hymnology in the School of Music at BNC/SNU for 27 years. During that time, she was the force behind the installation of the Schlicker organ in Cantrell Music Hall.

Eleanor studied organ at Oklahoma City University, the Summer Academy for Organ in the Netherlands, and the Westfalische Landeskirche Musikschule in Germany, and during this time, Eleanor became acquainted with the German composer, Zsolt Gardonyi. She championed his music and subsequently brought him to BNC/SNU where students were privileged to perform his and his father's music.

Eleanor is an active member of the American Guild of Organists, having served as Dean of the Oklahoma City chapter. She is a member of Mu Phi Epsilon, the Hymn Society of America, and the American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers (ASCAP). Eleanor is a member of the Oklahoma City Orchestra League, and has served on the Board of Directors. She was presented a Lifetime Achievement Award by Oklahoma City's First Presbyterian Church.

Eleanor has continued to compose and arrange works for various publishers and has served as interim organist for various churches, often setting aside compensation to support the BNC/SNU School of Music with tuition assistance and scholarships.

Surpassing all these accomplishments, Eleanor's greatest joy of her life is being married to Don, and being mother of two boys, the grandmother of six, and the great-grandmother of two.

Commencement Information

ACADEMIC MACE

The honor of Academic Mace Bearer is awarded by a faculty vote to a senior member of the SNU faculty in recognition of dedicated service and outstanding qualities that exemplify the SNU motto "Character / Culture / Christ." Today the mace is carried by Dr. Heather Clemmer, Professor of History and Chair, Division of Social and Behavioral Sciences and Director of CUGS General Education. Dr. Clemmer has served full-time as a SNU faculty member since 2006.

The academic mace traces its origins to the medieval battle mace and royal scepter and was adopted in the 14th century as a symbol of the university's ideals and commitment to learning. On ceremonial occasions at SNU, the mace is carried by a senior faculty member at the head of the procession. For commencement exercises, the mace is placed in its stand to signal the beginning of the ceremony and removed to mark the ceremony's end.

The SNU academic mace made its inaugural journey in the May 2008 Commencement. It is crafted in walnut from a tree that once grew on SNU's campus, and the stand is made from wood salvaged from another historic SNU building called The Tabernacle where early Nazarenes once worshipped. Both of these pieces of wood, though cracked and flawed, were saved by the late Dr. Lyle Tullis, SNU Professor Emeritus of Sociology, whose life and service impacted countless SNU colleagues and students. His son, Dr. K. J. Tullis, used this wood to craft the mace.

HONORS AND REGALIA

Students graduating with high cumulative grade point averages are indicated in the candidate lists as follows. Grade point averages for the most recent semester may or may not be included.

*Cum laude - cumulative GPA of 3.50 through 3.74 **Magna cum laude - cumulative GPA of 3.75 through 3.89 *** Summa cum laude - cumulative GPA of 3.90 through 4.00

Hoods are unique to educational institutions and are vestments that identify the degree conferred and the granting institution. Students receiving master's degrees today are vested with a hood with the SNU colors identified in the silk lining. The edging of the hoods shows the colors of degrees conferred today: drab for Master of Business Administration, white for Master of Arts, golden-yellow for Master of Science, and light blue for Doctor of Education.

Cords and **medallions** worn by degree candidates signify membership in honor societies, participation in the Ronald E. McNair Postbaccalaureate Achievement program, participation in Student Support Services, participation in the Presidential Leadership Scholar program, participation in the LiveLast service program or completion of the SNU Honors Program. Military students and faculty are wearing red, white and blue cords signifying their service.

PRESIDENT'S AWARDS

The President's Award is the highest award given to one male and one female traditional, undergraduate SNU student selected by the faculty, staff, and administration of the University. The winners should demonstrate a commitment to Refining Character, Creating Culture, and Serving Christ through loyalty, cooperation, service, appreciation of learning, sportsmanship, and leadership, all through a Christlike example. The finalists are noted in the morning degree candidates list with the ^ symbol. The sculpture presented to recipients is entitled, "A Cup...in His Name" and was crafted by SNU alumnus Scott Stearman. Their names will be added to a plaque displaying names of recipients since 1940. This marks the 84th year for presenting this award.

DISTINGUISHED ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS

The Distinguished Achievement Award is an honor granted to students from each cohort in the School of Professional Studies. Selection is based on outstanding scholarship and exceptional leadership within the program and on recommendations by program directors, faculty and classmates. Recipients are identified with the ^ symbol in the degree candidates list. This marks the 37th year for the presentation of these awards.

COMMENCEMENT PERSONNEL

Faculty Marshals and the Office of Academic Affairs, in conjunction with other Commencement Planning Committee members, are primarily responsible for the planning and coordination of Commencement ceremonies.
