Speaker

DR. DEBORAH SHROPSHIRE

Deborah Shropshire, M.D., M.H.A., serves as the Director of Oklahoma Human Services and in summer 2023 was also named as the Cabinet Secretary for Human Services. She previously served as the Director of Child Welfare Services and the Deputy Director of Child Welfare Community Partnerships. She is a pediatrician who initially worked alongside Child Welfare through assisting with the medical needs of children in a foster shelter and developed the Fostering Hope clinic for long-term follow up of children in foster care and adoption, as well as advising Child Welfare on policy and training.

Dr. Shropshire obtained her medical degree from the University of Oklahoma College of Medicine, a Master's in Healthcare Administration degree from the University of Oklahoma College of Public Health, and a Bachelor's in Science degree from Southern Nazarene University. She is board-certified in pediatrics and serves on the executive committee for the American Academy of Pediatrics' Council on Foster Care, Adoption, and Kinship Care. She has won several local and national awards related to advocacy, including the Ray Helfer Award for Child Abuse Prevention presented by the National Alliance of Children's Trust and Prevention Funds and the Commissioner's Award for Outstanding Service in the Field of Child Abuse and Neglect from the U.S. Administration on Children, Youth, and Families.

Shropshire is perhaps best known for her passion, communication skills, and leadership in child welfare system improvement and transformation, both from roles outside and inside Oklahoma Human Services. She believes that child maltreatment could be eliminated under the right conditions, and that strengthening families prior to child welfare involvement is a significant step toward that solution.

Commencement Information

ACADEMIC MACE

The honor of Academic Mace Bearer is awarded by a faculty vote to a senior member of the SNU faculty in recognition of dedicated service and outstanding qualities that exemplify the SNU motto "Character / Culture / Christ." Today the mace is carried by Dr Sylvia Goodman, Professor and Chair, School of Rehabilitation Sciences. Dr. Goodman has served full-time as an SNU faculty member for 22 years.

The academic mace traces its origins to the medieval battle mace and royal scepter and was adopted in the 14th century as a symbol of the university's ideals and commitment to learning. On ceremonial occasions at SNU, the mace is carried by a senior faculty member at the head of the procession. For commencement exercises, the mace is placed in its stand to signal the beginning of the ceremony and removed to mark the ceremony's end.

The SNU academic mace made its inaugural journey in the May 2008 Commencement. It is crafted in walnut from a tree that once grew on SNU's campus, and the stand is made from wood salvaged from another historic SNU building called The Tabernacle where early Nazarenes once worshipped. Both of these pieces of wood, though cracked and flawed, were saved by the late Dr. Lyle Tullis, SNU Professor Emeritus of Sociology, whose life and service impacted countless SNU colleagues and students. His son, Dr. K. J. Tullis, used this wood to craft the mace.

HONORS AND REGALIA

Undergraduate students graduating with high cumulative grade point averages are indicated in the candidate lists as follows. Grade point averages for the most recent semester may or may not be included.

*Cum laude - cumulative GPA of 3.50 through 3.74 **Magna cum laude - cumulative GPA of 3.75 through 3.89 *** Summa cum laude - cumulative GPA of 3.90 through 4.00

Hoods are unique to educational institutions and are vestments that identify the degree conferred and the granting institution. Students receiving master's degrees today are vested with a hood with the SNU colors identified in the silk lining. The edging of the hoods shows the colors of degrees conferred today: drab for Master of Business Administration and Master of Leadership, white for Master of Arts, golden-yellow for Master of Science, and light blue for Doctor of Education.

Cords and **medallions** worn by degree candidates signify membership in honor societies, participation in the Ronald E. McNair Postbaccalaureate Achievement program, participation in Student Support Services, participation in the Presidential Leadership Scholar program, participation in the LiveLast service program or completion of the SNU Honors Program. Military students and faculty are wearing red, white, and blue cords signifying their service.

DISTINGUISHED ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS

The Distinguished Achievement Award is an honor granted to students from each cohort in the School of Professional Studies. Selection is based on outstanding scholarship and exceptional leadership within the program and on recommendations by program directors, faculty and classmates. Recipients are identified with the ^ symbol in the degree candidates list. This marks the 38th year for the presentation of these awards.

Faculty Marshals and the Office of Academic Affairs, in conjunction with other Commencement Planning Committee members, are primarily responsible for the planning and coordination of Commencement ceremonies.
